



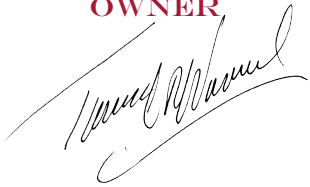

The CANTERBURY HOTEL Indianapolis

HOTEL HISTORY

The Canterbury Hotel has a lodging lineage that extends back to the 1850's. In 1858, prominent Indiana architect Francis Costigan designed and built the Oriental Hotel. The hotel's name was later changed to The Mason House, and then again to the Oxford Hotel. In 1928, the majority of the hotel was demolished to make room for a 12-story 200 room hotel called The Lockerbie. The reinforced concrete facade with brick and trimmed in terra cotta is the same outer structure standing today.

In 1936, Glenn Warren, a native of Chicago, took a 15 year lease on the hotel and it operated as The Warren until 1973. In 1983, the property was purchased by Fred Tucker, Don Fortunato, and Fred Nilsson who announced plans to totally renovate the building. They created an outstanding intimate luxury hotel with European traditions and ambience. The structure now had 99 guest rooms, including 6 bi-level suites. It was to reflect the charm and historical quality of Canterbury, England, The Canterbury Hotel.
